 In Memory of Mary Ruberti – 4<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

Dear Friends,

I blame it on the lawyers. No one will ever just admit they did something wrong. The question is evaded. No one takes responsibility. "I misspoke," the politicians say, never "I lied."

In South Africa, for years the nation was ruled by the tiny white minority and they used torture and murder to suppress the majority of the people. When they finally had a freely elected government, the Prime Minister, Nelson Mandela, had Tribunals of Reconciliation throughout the country. Government officials who ordered torture and the policemen and soldiers who carried out those orders had to admit what they had done, even up to and including murder. Family members who had relatives taken in the night by the police and never heard from them again could at least know what had happened to their loved ones.

Now this is the amazing part. No one was put in jail or executed for what they had done. In admitting their sin, they were forgiven and the country could move forward, which it is doing now. It wasn't about political "spin" on Fox or CNN. It was about admitting the truth and moving on, knowing that in the truth is found forgiveness. Whether in the Old Testament or in the New, that is what God expects of us.

Admitting we have done wrong is not a sign of weakness. It is a sign of strength, strength rooted in our experience of the endless forgiveness and mercy of God.
